Cheverolet is off, but not too much. All the Chrysler products are in trouble, with Dodge sales especially bad. Down about 80%. The whole industry, all makes taken into account, is off almost exactly one-third, or 33-1/3%...Thunderbird is still back-ordered.

As for the new cars, they'll start appearing at the beginning of September. Buick will be first out, followed closely xx by some six or eight makes scheduled for Sept. introduction. Almost all the rest will be out in October, with a couple exceptions that won't appear until November. The big thinkers from Detroit, (quote: those little foreign cars are just a fad) seeing how poor sales are and knowing they aren't going to do too much better, are coming out early in order to stimulate new car sales the last three months of '58 in order to offset the deficit left during the second quarter. The Detroit brains, in an effort to hoodwink the public, predicted a 6 million car year for '58, but now will be more than happy to settle for four million. GH's complete line will be drastically restyled, with such inovations as Olds with four headlights spaced all the way across the front, Cheve with new fins, more sculptured make your reservations at Carson City or rear end Buick with canted hadlights (a la Lincoln) and so on. Not to be outdone, Ford is also 'going the route.' Over one billion dollars is being spent on redesign; scarcely a year after a pretty complete changeover.
