My assistant editor (?) suggests the following would be helpful for all you who might be interested. (I still don't know how he got to be assistant editor.)

"HOW TO CONVERT YOUR CORVETTE INTO A ROAD RACING BEAST"

Take off the top, windshield, front and rear bumpers, exhaust system and part of the front fenders. Then remove the engine, transmission, and differential. Step back and admire the mess you have on your garage floor. Next call all five of your children and tell them to dismantle the engine, transmission and differential. (If you don't have enought to make five, I will be glad to lend all or part of mine.) You almost have to ask the children to dismantle everything, because they have your tools scattered all over the place.

Lets start on the differential. First you contact the Getx Gear Co. in Indianapolis for a good selection of road gears, from 5.70/1 to 2.85/1. Cost: \$75.00 per set and stock because they have produced more than the required amount. Then run the kids out of sight and install the gears into the car carefully. (Be sure you are alone.) Now send your drive line out to be balanced while you overhaul your transmission. Place an order with Warner Gear Works in Anderson, Indiana for the high ratio low and 2nd gears. Install these along with your present 3rd and 4th. Makes it real good from the (standing?) start.

Next your flywheel and clutch. Sheifer is good. Now!! Block stripped, here is where it really counts. First install you production cam, Racer Brown preferred, then your chromed 180' crankshaft. (Helps with 2 cylinders firing at once.) Cost: around \$200 with core. Get (six) boxed rods: \$240.00 for 8, and Forge Pistons: 10 for \$117 (In case you break a couple). Timing Chain? Use a roller type (less friction). Send complete crankshaft, rods, pistons, flywheel (9 lbs.), and clutch disc out for balancing.

Then install in your 4 inch, worn out black. (It must be worn out because it is 4 inches.) Now we are ready for the heads. Remember you must keep within the production rules. So far everything done has had more than 150 build. Match your ports and open the valve chambers. Install 2 - 1/8" intake valves (used in GMC Products). Match all valves. They must be of same weight. Take them to your favorite Speed Shop and have them matched. Be sure you have your heads and manifold adapter razor sharp so there will be no restriction.

Pick through the parts room and get a good and even set of valve springs, tension wise. If someone asks the compression ratio you can say 11.5/. (Heads off)

Never take any off the head, because if you are protested, they always C.C. the heads, never the combustion chambers. So take it off the block. Install heads on the block assembly. Take the back plate off your water pump and grind off every other impeller on the pump. Take off the fan blade and have it balanced. Not compulsary, but impressive. Assemble all engine parts in their proper place. Install a 2 gallon oil reserve tank in the right front fender panel, between the outer fender panel and inner shirt because you wouldn't want to run out of oil during a race. Run an oil line to the side of your oil pan. Call it an oil

temperature gauge line, if in question. Set the engine, transmission and drive line into your Corvette. Take it to your favorite tuner and have the car tuned on the dyno. Be sure he understands you have a new engine in the car so he doesn't run it over 7,000 rpm. Use Castrol racing oil because it smells nasty. Your exhaust system must come out behind the driver. Be sure it is a tuned exhaust system and long enough to meet the required lengths (or you may have to run your car plugged up). You should pull no less than 220 horsepower at the rear wheels. After the tune up take your car home and have the children clean it up good. To make sure they do a good job, sit with a good supply of refreshments in your cooler. (Everyone to his own choice.) Lets see now, you have your racing tires out having them capped and your car is ready to race. Have you forgotton. anything? Ask the children if they have any suggestion. Mike says, "Daddy, you need a roll bar." Pat suggests a safety belt. Timothy asks, "Where is the tow bar and bumper?" Kelly has the tape in his hands for the headlights. Robin wants to know, "What number are you going to use, daddy?" Holly wants to see the check book. Who drank all my beer? You know, then, after all the preparation, you are ready to race and you can tell everyone you have a perfect race car "B" Production. (That is if your name happens to start ith a "B".) Mine is "K" Production.
