The meeting was called to order by President Ken Altman at Central Chevrolet in Fremont at 8:15 p.m. There were 23 voting members present. Ken welcomed all fellow aquanauts and thank them for coming!

Ron Trethan, Membership Director, introduced the guests who were: McCowan, Morrell, Miller, Boyle, Marina, Austin.

The minutes were read and approved.

Public Relations Director, Milt Piver, gave a report on the shop nite held last week at Chabot College. The next date available is March 26th. Milt will give a complete list of dates available at the April meeting at G.M. T.C. If anyone is interested in working on their cars at this shop nite, contact Milt for information. Mr. Miller, a guest, said he had a 400 H.P. dyno available for free at his place of business. He will see about getting a group in there to work on their cars and report back to Ken.

Membership Director, Ron Trethan, welcomed another guest to our meeting, Jack Jansek. Ron said the new roster of members will be handed out at the April meeting.

Under Publications, Vicky Altman said the deadline for this month's K. is tonight. The paper will be printed this weekend and new members names will be in print long enough to bring them in at the next meeting.

The meeting was called to order at 8:25 p.m. by President Ken Altman.

August 11th and November 10th but that we have no places to hold them so far. Gary then gave the results of the past autocrosses for 1968 and club members finishing positions. Social Director, Jack Irasmith, was not present. Ken reported on the WSCC dinner-meeting. We all started to rib Mike Tsirlis about his weekend and Cotati. Mike corrected Ken about his speed from 90 MPH to 110 MPH! Ken reminded everyone about the March 22 meeting at Central Chevrolet and since Frank Camallari was present he asked him kindly to supply the VO instead of coffee and sandwiches! Ron Trethan said the caravan to Vernalis would meet at Max Gumm's at 7:00 Sunday morning.

Minutes continued --

Ken told about an insurance meeting to be held Thursday, March 14 at 7:30 p.m. at Me & Ed's Pizza Parlor in the Fremont Hub. He also said that we have not heard a thing from SCCA concerning our use of their insurance. Chris gave a report on Cotati's autocross the past weekend. Ken complimented NCC/ members on their attendence at the last 2 autocrosses and the WSCC weekend. Still under New Business Ken said that Portland is asking for club sponserships of full page ads. He suggested that if we can't get businesses to take one out that NCC/A donate \$25.00. The deadline is April for publication. Ken then discussed the matter of proxy vote. Ron made a motion that we give our vote by proxy to a club at the meeting in Fresno. Chris, alas the distruber, seconded the motion. A discussion followed. Milt called for the question. Last year the NCCA tried to obtain a sponsor. But due to various reasons, this idea fell through. This year we worked on getting a shop so that members would be able to work on their Corvettes with top equip-The shop we were able to obtain is the automotive shop of the Hayward Vocational Skill Center. The Center is run by the Hayward School District. The facilities are really super. The shop has a wheel alignment pit, electrical testing instruments, brake turning tools, automotive machine equipment, a Sun 1020 tune-up scope, and a 200 horsepower Clayton dyno. This dyno is quite small for a Corvette, but if all works out, the school is planning to convert this over to a 400 H.P. dyno. In addition to this, there are complete sets of hand and power tools available. The club was able to get this shop with certain restrictions. If anyone would like to use the dyno, he must be at the shop by 7:00 p.m. sharp. The shop nights are Tuesdays from 7:00 to 10:00 p.m. On shop nights, we will meet at my house (19139 Christensen Court, Castro Valley) at 6:30 p.m. and proceed to the shop. I will make a schedule of shop nights in the next Kalcidoscope.

On shop nights we share the shop with a parochial organization. We have been limited to five cars a night, but if anyone has machine work to be done, he is perfectly welcome to come in addition to the five cars. In the summer months unfortunately there will be no shop nights.

The club had its first night of shop on March 12. This was a big success. There were four member cars and one prospective member's car participating. It is my understanding that everything went along smoothly. Our shop nights will have to be worked out by appointment and by rotation of our club roster, depending on how many members are interested.

The next shop night will be March 26. Possibly a few members will not have this Kaleidoscope by then, but contact me at the April 2nd meeting at G.M.T.C. for the tentative shop nights of April 9, 16, 23, and 30th. At this time I will know the exact nights. If you are unable to attend the meeting or need an appointment or further assistance, you can contact me at home after 5:00 p.m. at 538-7719.

I hope that all members will be albe to benefit by having this shop.




