WSCC REPORT (December 5, 1970 - San Leandro)

The proposed WSCC dues increase of \$5.00 per member car was voted down by member clubs. One of the most important reasons for this trend of the voting was the fact that the Council has had a very large miscellaneous expense account in the past. Even though our club decided to vote in favor of the proposal, it may be best to have the vote go in this direction for awhile anyway. It will make the Executive Board of WSCC take a closer look at the miscellaneous expenditure of the council.

However, two unfortunate instances occurred in the Council because of lack of funds. We didn't have enough finances to produce the December issue of the WSCC Newsletter. And because of the obvious lack of funds, WSCC has had to back out of the Convention Expo '71 in St. Louis. The reason for this is because the policy for Expo '71 was on a 50/50 basis. If the Convention profited, WSCC and NCCC would split the profit, and the same idea applied to any losses. But at this time WSCC cannot afford any losses. The Council was asked to make a deposit in a separate bank account for the Convention. All our Council can say at this time is "Deposit What?" There are no funds. Now it is up to NCCA to produce not a pre-convention, but a convention for WSCC in 1971. We have been asked to change our event title of pre-convention to read WSCC Convention '71. We did just that under the conditions that we will run the event under pre-convention rules. We will not accept financial assistance from WSCC and our club will finance the event. Need I say more, Gang? We're putting on the WSCC Convention for 1971.

At the meeting there was a discussion of the B.C. Corvette Club's losses from their Convention. Examples: \$150.00 for paving the holes left in the parking lot of the Institute of Technology of British Columbia, which was the autocross site. Also \$150.00 for a steeplejack to re-install rope of the flag pole on top of the Hotel. What you see here is just a small part of the miscellaneous expenses incurred by the B.C. Club. A complete report is supposed to be given at the New Mexico meeting.

Corvettes of So. Cal. is offering Council members scatter shields for \$67.50 per 10 member order. Also, Corvettes of So. Cal. will be hosting the 4th Annual All Crovette Drag Meet on January 2, 1971. The site of the meet is the Orange County International Raceway. For further information please contact me.

The next WSCC meeting will be hosted by the New Mexico Corvette Assn. in Albuquerque, New Mexico on February 27, 1971.

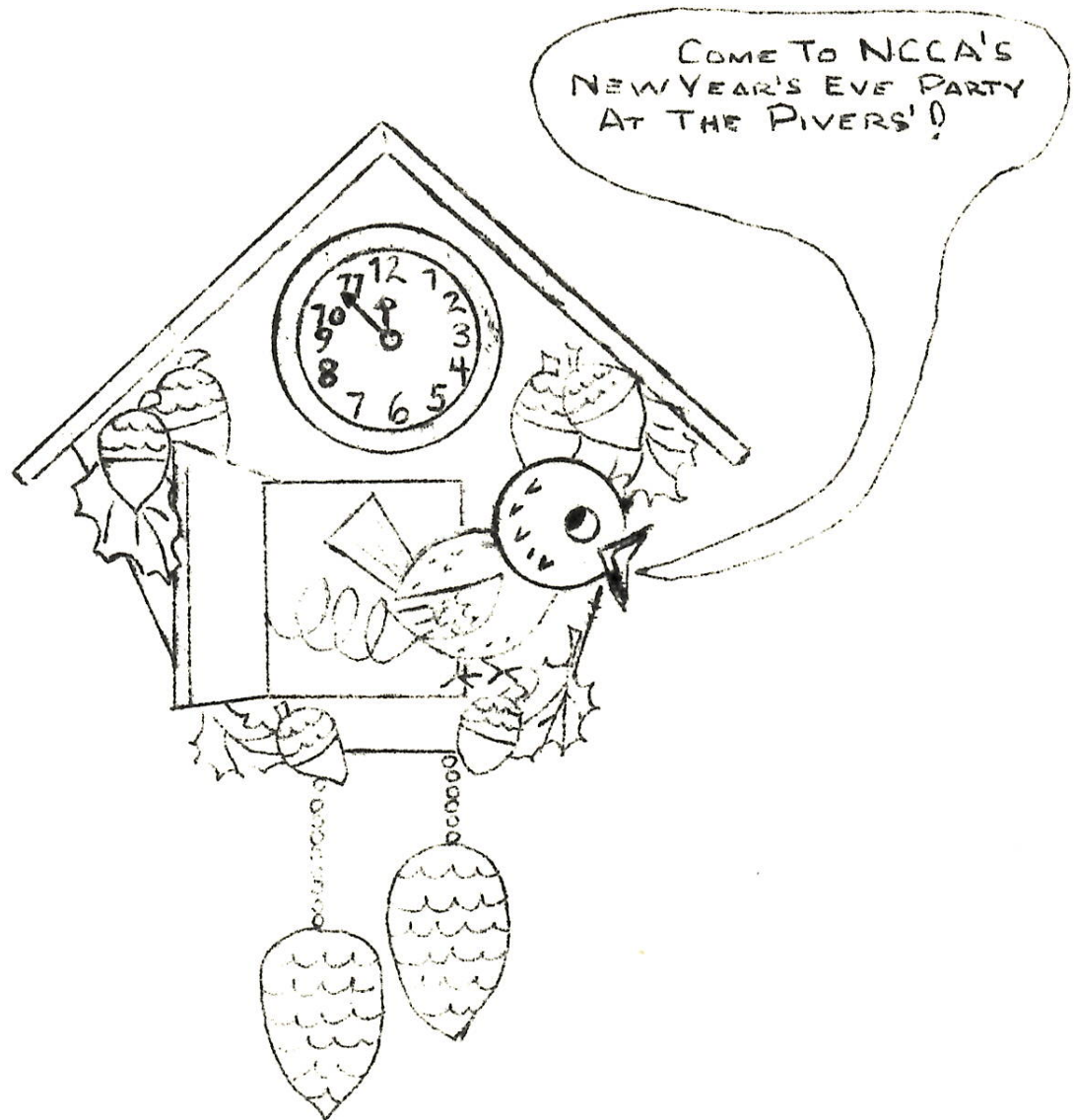
