Most of us ran fairly early both days and spent the afternoon at one of the turns with the Corvette Owners Club of Sacramento, drinking beer and helping men the corners as far as rocks, getting off-course people back on course, pushing blown engines off course, and sweeping up oil and miscellaneous other items. On Saturday evening, we went over to a bar-be-que hosted by Corvette Owners Club of Sacramento. Beer, steak sandwiches, salad, green beans, corn, potato chips, pretzels, and what have you was served. At our July meeting we will have a guest speaker from Sta-Power. The gentleman's name is Phil Bond. Phil will give us a demonstration on how his product does a job in your motor. 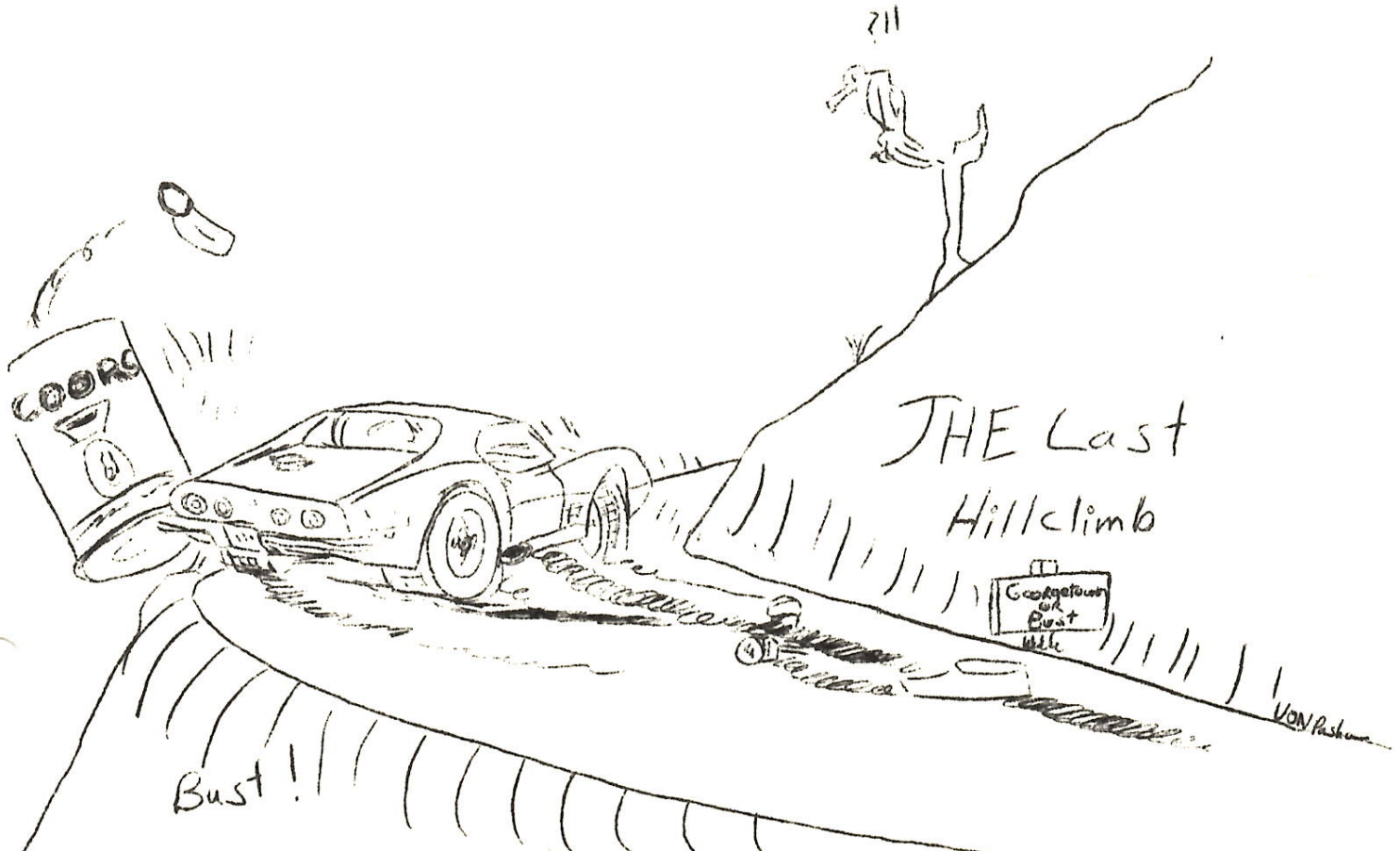

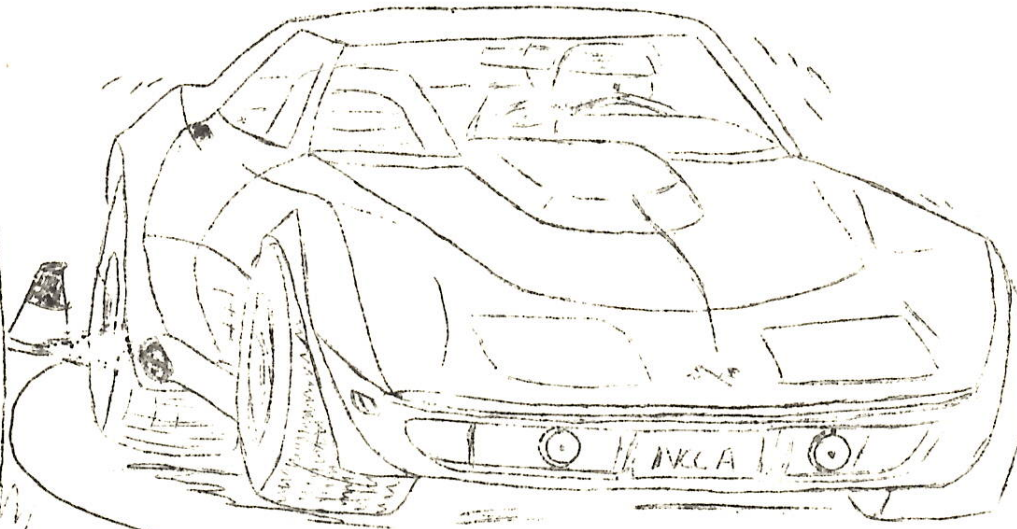

The meeting was called to order by President Gary Carlen at 8:28 p.m. There were 32 members and guests present. Gary thanked the members for their help in staging the Convention. Membership Director, Hank Lopez, introduced the guests as Bob Dunn of North Bay Corvette Association, Deena Simmons, and Terry Shirey. The minutes of the May meeting were printed in the Kaleidoscope and approved as printed.

Treasurer's Report: Rod Baker gave the balance in the club's treasury. A financial report on the Convention will be given next month after all of the Convention bills come in. He said we had 340 for dinner on Saturday and 350 on Sunday, and 150 for Breakfast on Monday of the Convention weekend.

Activities: Milt Piver asked for everyone's participation at our June 6 event. He reported on the upcoming autocrosses, with a special run-down on Captain Weber Day in Stockton. The date is July 11, with registration at 8:00 a.m. There will be a Top Time of Day before noon. Sharon Trethan said there will be a 250 car limit. There will be a caravan driving to Stockton. Further details will be in the June Kaleidoscope. Following the autocross, NCCA members will be going to the Benningers' home for a swim party. Milt then reported on the June 12 & 13 Hillelimb at Georgetown. Milt presented a trophy to Bill Geen for winning at Nor-Cal Chevy's event on May 23. TILLIE'S TIPS (From The Vette Gazette, by The Denver Corvette Association, June '71)

"Hot Feet got you Hot under the Collar?"  
Does the floor of your '68 or newer Corvette get hot enough to curl the leather on your shoes??? On hot summer days does the passenger compartment reach the boiling point??? I think I've discovered part of the cause and a cure. It seems Chevrolet in their infinite wisdom installed on the '63 thru '67 Vettes some heat shields on the exhaust pipes as they passed under the floor boards but for reasons known only to them (maybe they wanted to sell more air conditioning units) they have neglected to install them since '68. If you cannot find these shields at a wrecking yard they can be bought through Chevrolet parts for about \$4.00 and go a long way towards solving the "Hot Foot" problem. For the small Dia. pipes you'll need part #3828281 LH and part #3864178 RH. For the large Dia. pipes (2 1/2") you'll need part #3851673 LH and part #3851674 RH. You will also need 4 straps part #3828291 and 4 screws #10, 12x3/4.

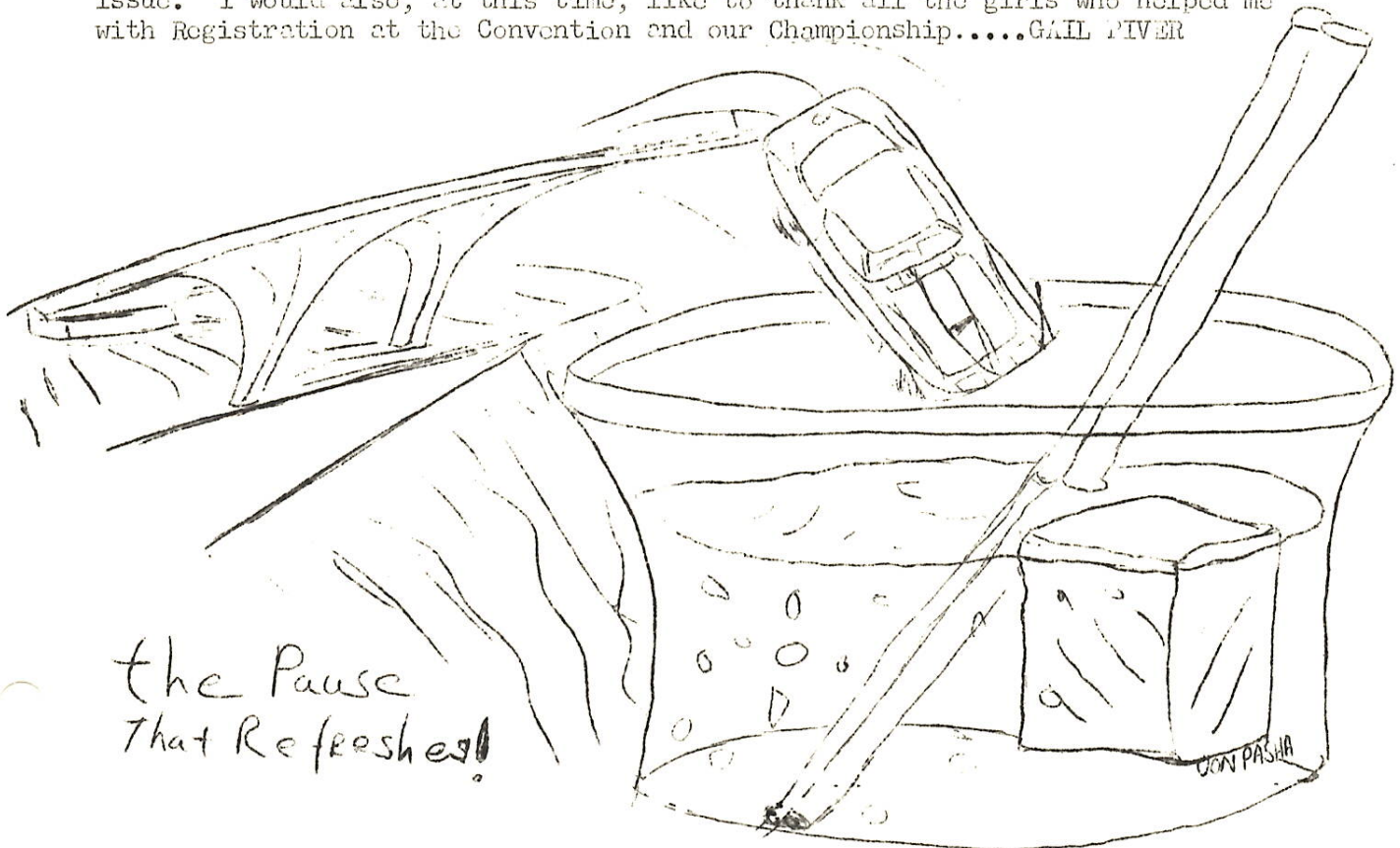
