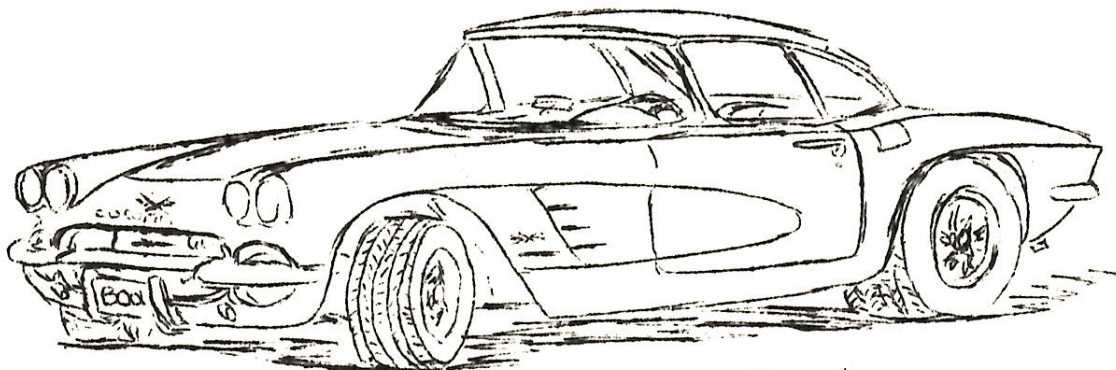

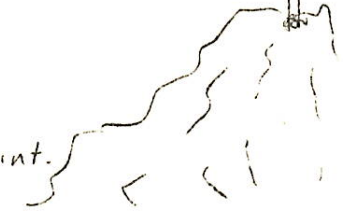
If you have any ideas for cartoons or articles see me. After all, this is your paper and should consist of things that interest you.
