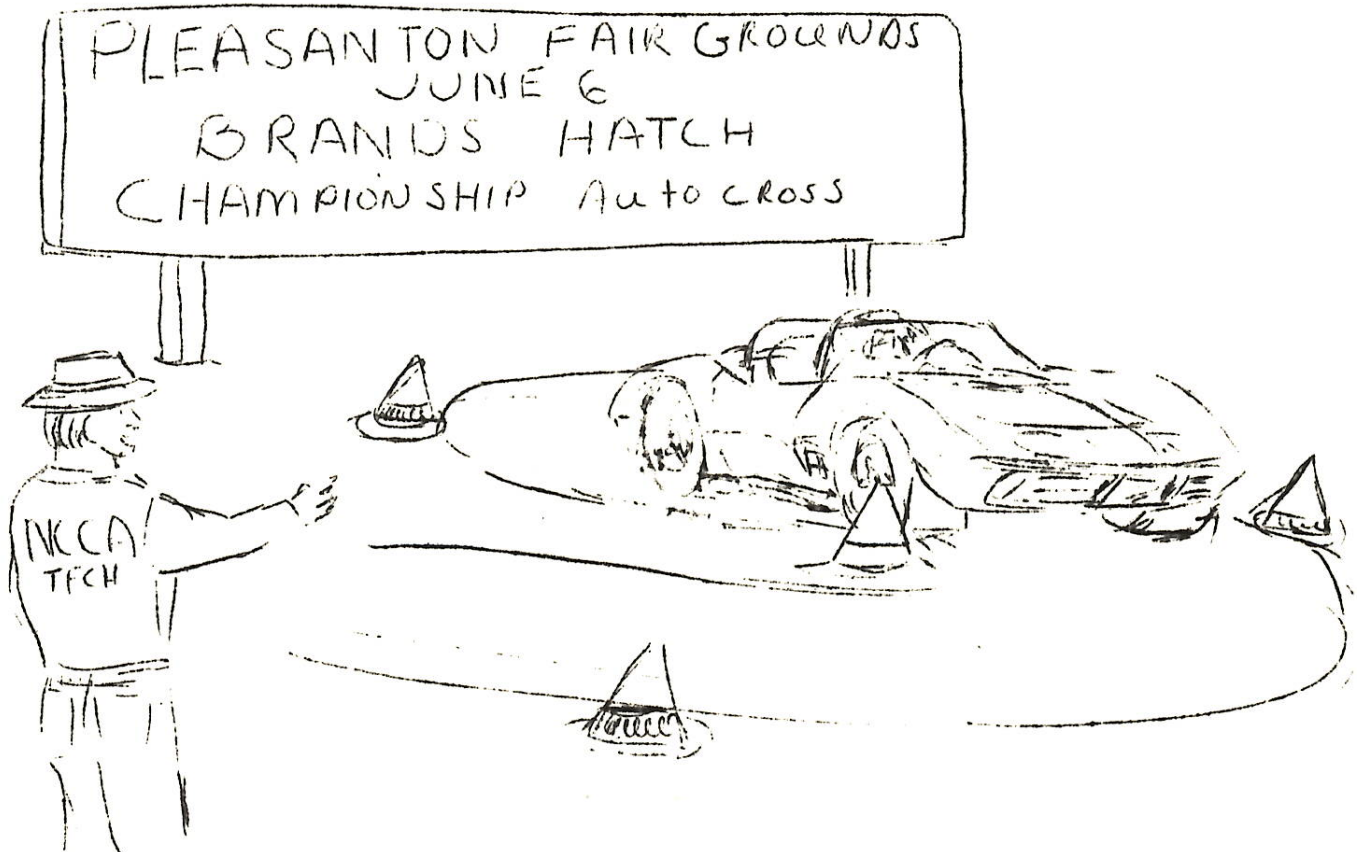
To all of you who helped make the Limit 100 a success thank you very much. Hope to see you all present and ready to help once again, June 4th.

GENERAL MEETING MINUTES - MAY 2, 1972

The meeting was called to order by President Jerry Lockwood at 8:20 p.m. There were 28 members and guests present. Nancy Lockwood, acting Membership Director, introduced the guests.

The Vice-President and Secretary were absent due to illness in the family. The minutes of the April General Meeting were approved as printed.

Treasurer's Report: John Mah gave the balance in the treasury and explained that a separate financial report on our Limit 100 autocross will be given at the June meeting, as all expenses have not been turned into him as yet.

Activities Report: Jerry thanked members for helping at the event April 30th. He announced the coming events. Ron Trethan asked if a team was set up for championship points. Lee Peer reported there is one team, and also read the different club's standings. Milt Piver asked if flyers for NCCA's June 4th event were made up. He was told they will be out the first week of May.

Membership Report: Nancy Lockwood was to bring in Doug and Linda Newmaster as new members, however, they were not present.

Social Report: Samantha O'Brien is on vacation, so Jerry gave the report. May 6 is a Tricycle Party to be held at the Lockwoods'. Pee Wee Golf will be in July, also the Captain Weber Day Social at the Trethans' on July 9. A beach party will be in August, and members are asked to collect firewood. May 13 is a beauty pageant in San Carlos. Those members with roadsters who wish to drive contestants in a parade are asked to contact Jerry. Jim Saxton of Diablo Valley Corvettes gave details of their June 24-25 overnight social. There will be a barbecue steak dinner, a live band (BYOB), and breakfast in the morning. Bring sleeping bags. Also included is a hayride at Pacheco Ranch in Novato. Cost: \$8.00 per person.

Public Relations: Karen Pasha took care of this office until this meeting when the election of a new Public Relations Director took place. Clark Nelson was nominated by Milt Piver, seconded by Gary Carlen. As there were no further nominations, they were closed, and it was unanimous that Clark receive the office.

Publications Report: Jim Pasha gave the deadline for the Kaleidoscope as April 15. He brought a model of a switch system for lights to be used at events instead of a flag man. This idea is to be brought up at the NCSCC meeting. There was a discussion on course safety. Jim explained ads and costs for the Kaleidoscope. Harriet Gittings sent Jim a letter with information about a parts swap on June 10, and a rally school on June 11. See Jim for details.

Old Business: There was an E-Board recommendation that the dues for a new member be increased to \$15. initiation fee, and \$15. dues, for a total of \$30., not including WSCC dues, and that the dues for a regular member be increased to \$15. per year plus mandatory WSCC membership for a total of \$20. Following a discussion, the proposal was voted on and passed.

New Business: Jerry announced that at the June meeting there will be an election for the office of Membership Director, due to Dave Dickson's continuing absence. A letter has been sent to Dave explaining this.

Bill Marconi made a motion that Article V, Section A, Paragraph C of the NCCA By-Laws, regarding consistent inactivity of members, be enforced. Bill will bring the names of those who didn't help at the last autocross to the E-Board.

Speed Events: Lee Pcer read the points standings for club members. Lee asked the club's opinion regarding the council's stand on roll bars for open cars: Should this be invoked for this year, or for the beginning of the 1973 autocross season? Gary Carlen moved for 1973, Bill Marconi, seconded, and it passed.

NCSCC: Bill Marconi reported on the NCSCC council meeting. There was no penalty issued on the Marin GT event in Coddington. He reminded the members not to send views cards to own club members with the club's event results. June 1st is the deadline to pay your money for the Golden State Grand Prix in Santa Maria. Advertisements for NCCA's events and personal ads in WHEELSPORT will be free for the year, if all club members subscribe to WHEELSPORT. He suggested putting our meeting dates in the sports section of the Chronicle. Bill warned members not to purchase raffle tickets from Manor Youth (organization to aid drug abuse), as the Better Business Bureau has confirmed that this is a gimmick.

WSCC: Concour judges are needed for the Convention. Roger Boaz and Nancy Lockwood volunteered.

Announcements: Gary Carlen announced the Virginia City Hill Climb to be held June 4th weekend (same as our championship event). The following weekend will be the Georgetown Hill Climb. Gary will concour his car at the Convention if some members will give a hand. Clark Nelson needs two stock '66 Corvette wheels. Rich Garner has a set of 15's with tires for \$250. Drawings were held for pizza (won by Stella Mah), and beer (Paul Martinez), and the meeting was adjourned to Koppie's at 10:20 p.m.

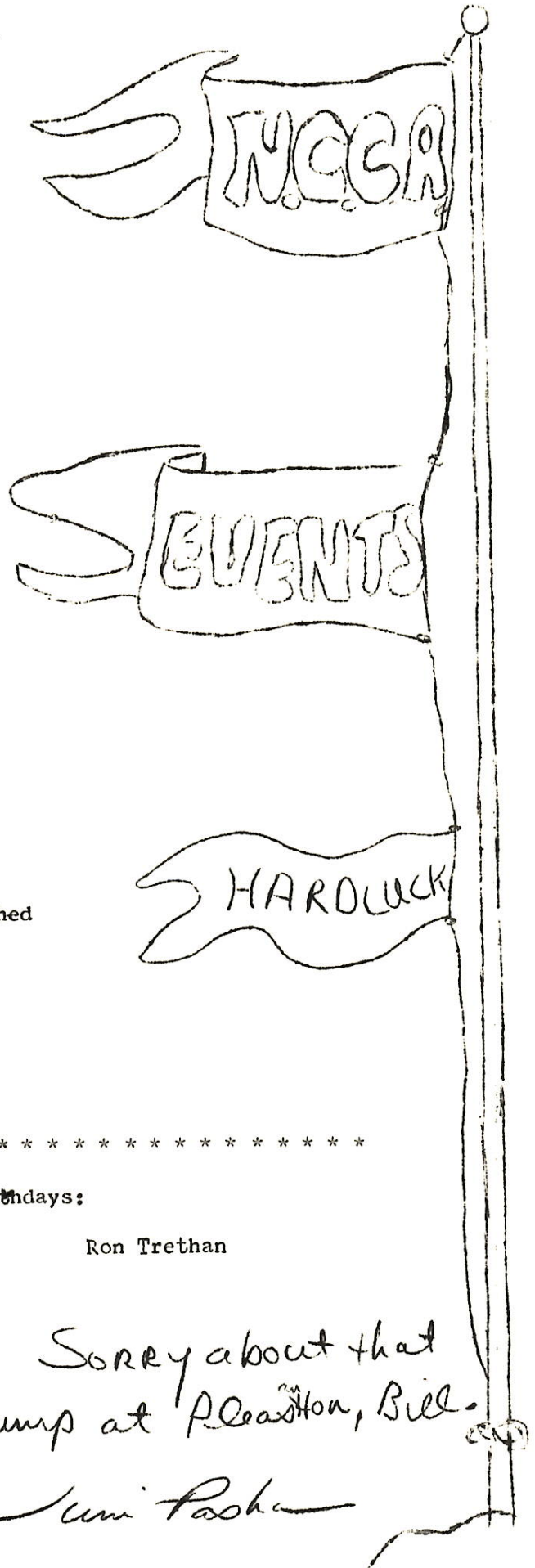

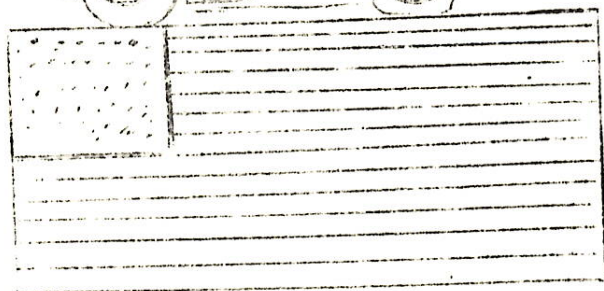
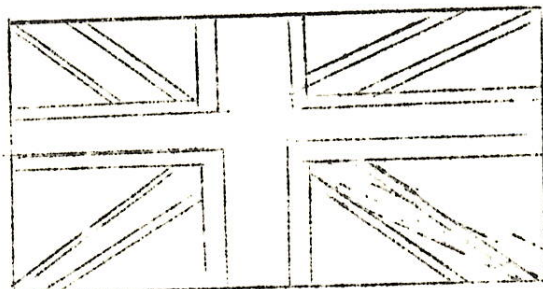
