MORTHERN CALIFORNIA CORVETTE ASSOCIATION REGULAR MEETING - FEBRUARY 6, 1973

The regular meeting of the Northern California Corvette Association was called to order by President Mike Irish at General Motors Training Center at 8:15 P.M.. There were 15 members and 13 guests present.

The guests present were: Ken & Joy Atkinson, Jack McDonald, Lynne Dilsarier, Jim Roberts, Ed Gonzales, Jeff Peek, Chuck Lofgren, Mike Halloran, Bob Stephano, Kon West, Lee Houck and one lady guest whom didn't sign the guest book.

Minutes - Mike Irish explained that the December 5, 1972 minutes had been lost in the mail and were rewritten as recalled to be read to the membership for approval. Secretary Lynne Irish then read the minutes of the December 5, 1972 meeting. A motion to accept the minutes as read was moved, seconded and carried. A motion to approve the minutes of the January 9, 1973 meeting as printed in the January issue of the Kaleidoscope was moved, seconded and carried.

Treasurers Report - Treasurer Samantha O'Brien read the balance of the Treasury as of February 6, 1973. Joe Silverman moved we accept the Treasurers Report. Jim Pasha seconded. The motion carried.

Activities - Vice President Jerry Olson thanked the members who showed up to work the Autocross. He announced our Autocross on June 3rd was not a NCSCC Championship Event. Milt Piver asked why this was not a Championship Event. Jerry stated it was because we filed too late. Milt suggested we file for WSCC sanctioning of our Autopross on June 3rd. A discussion followed. Mike Irish suggested before we do anything that we should let Lee Peer see what he can find out at the Autocross Committee meeting on February 20th why we were not given a Championship date for June 3rd. Jerry Olson then read off a list of the upcoming Autocrosses.

Membership - Membership Director Rudy Pretti stated that there were no new members to be brought in this month.

Social - Social Director Nancy Lockwood gave a rundown on our Trailer Cleanup Party. Nancy told about a crab feed on February 23rd. Milt Piver had a block of tickets and would like to see some NCCA members go. It's all the crab you can eat at \$5.50 per person - Drinks 65¢ each of 10 for 5 dollars. Nancy Lockwood announced an Ice Skating Party for February. Helen Clott is making arrangements. The date is yet to be set.

Public Relations - Public Relations Director Rich Garner was at work so Mike Irish informed the membership of the work Rich had done and the coverage we had received in the newspapers. He mentioned that our "Limit 100" and our meeting received excellent coverage in the S.F. Chronicle.

Publications - Publications Director Cindy Krug said that articles for the Kaleidoscope would be due by February 9th. She asked the officers to bring their articles to the E-Board meeting Friday night.

New Business - Joe Silverman made a suggestion that we ask the Alameda Fairgrounds personnel to have at least one restroom unlocked all day for our Autocrosses.

NCSCC - Jerry Olson stated that he, Mike and Lynne Irish attended the Council meeting January 25th. Jerry mentioned that a request for sanctioning was submitted at that meeting and that NCCA now has a November 4th NCSCC Championship Autocross. Discussion followed. SVSCC - Mike Irish read a letter he had written to Sacramento Valley Sports Car Council that went along with our check for SVSCC 1973 dues. He then read a reply letter from SVSCC stating they were happy we rejoined. Now NCCA members will be able to run for SVSCC Championship points.

WSCC - Nancy Lockwood said she and Jerry are still looking for a site for our Concour D'Corvette. She stated that they would appreciate any suggestions or information on possible sites. Mike Irish gave a rundown on the WSCC meeting as far as our Bid to print the WSCC booklet. He stated that he tryed to get the Club Representatives to reconsider their motion of the previous meeting turning over the decision to the WSCC E-Board. Mike said that the motion was defeated by one vote as the meeting was attended by many new Club Representatives unaware as to what has been taking place. Mike stated that the decision as to whom gets the Bid to print the WSCC booklot will be made by Treasurer Harvey Kaufman of WSCC. He also stated that NCCA would submit a Bid for the 4th time since October 1972. Milt Piver said that the members of NCCA would be receiving flyers regarding the WSCC Convention in Tucson soon and that the Casino Night will be on Saturday night instead of Friday night as indicated on the flyer. Mike Irish stated that the next WSCC meeting will be April 21st at the Fresno Hilton starting at 1:00 P.M..


